English- Australian Curriculum

Students will:

- Develop sound and letter knowledge
- Develop sight word knowledge
- Compose texts through speaking, writing and creating texts
- Comprehend texts through listening, viewing and reading
- Develop speaking and listening skills through a range of oral language learning tasks

Mathematics- Australian Curriculum

Students will develop mathematical knowledge through:

- Understanding the relationship between numerals, number names and quantities working towards 20
- Counting on, subitising and using a number line
- Describe position and movement and follow simple directions
- Compare and describe length and mass of everyday objects
- Use language to describe location
- Sorting objects based on common characteristics

Science- Australian Curriculum

Forces – objects and toys

Children are able to describe how objects move in different ways and describe how shape, size influence movement. They are able to explain how force impacts motion.
